



<u>Electronic Tablet Job Coach Project</u>: Received renewal grant. Expected start up Spring 2022 for year two. Applications will be sent out to SC's in March. Selections will be held April 2022

<u>Grant opportunities:</u> Employment services is actively researching grants that the program qualifies for.

<u>Education</u>: Employment Services hosted a BSW Social Work intern this quarter from Texas State University. We will be bring in another Social Work intern from UTSA in Spring of 2022. The program also hosted a paid work experience intern from the Workforce Solutions Alamo.



# IDDS Employment & Education Initiatives

#### **Employment Program with TWC**

**Employment Services (ES)-** program provides comprehensive recruiting, job search, and related services to businesses and job seekers to connect employers seeking workers and individuals seeking employment. There are currently 24 TWC individuals and several incoming referrals. Clients are achieving benchmarks regularly, employers gained and have individuals placed at their companies are: E-Controls, Tower Semiconductor, Fiesta Texas, 4M building solutions, Roots Salad Kitchen, Jim's, Magnolia Pancake Haus. Employers interested in hiring, Frontier Enterprises (Jim's, La Fonda, Magic Time Machine, Frontier burger) Whataburger, Silver Solutions LLC, Fort Sam ISD, Texas Roadhouse, ABM, Marco's Pizza, Allied Health.

Services include: Job Skills Training and Bundled Job Placement Services, Career Development training, Resume Building, Professional Development trainings and more

**JST**: assistance for individuals who currently are employed but may need additional training on their job description or may require a mandatory training from their employers that may consist of computer assessments etc. ES also helps the individuals through there NEO as well as any OJT the new employee may receive.

**JPS**: this is a purchased item from TWC that consist of 3 benchmark that an individual will go through. On top of gaining employment the individual will go through several trainings including resume building/creating, interview preparation, how to properly fill out a job application and the different types, and how to use online job searching databases



# IDDS Employment & Education Initiatives

### **Employment Program with TWC**

#### **Externally our Employment Specialist:**

-meets with TWC Counselors on a monthly basis for updates/referrals at Vendor Meetings
-requests the TWC counselors for their current Employment Service Providers lists
-gathers logistics on all referrals and their local TWC service areas (there are 5 operating TWC offices in the Bexar County service area)
-establishes communication lines between parties; Employment Service Providers, AACOG, and TWC Counselors
-set monthly or quarterly goals for outreach events in the public to show that we are driving force in employment services
-reaching out to school districts for those students who are graduating or in transitional services to gain employment
-maintains accurate data to follow up on increasing referrals

#### Internally our Employment Specialist:

-meets with AACOG's PR team about employment services to post online

-attends IDDS team meeting presentations

- -explains employment service and referral process to SC
- -explains client CHOICE regarding TWC provider as well as employment and employment provider
- -coordinates services with Service Coordination

-double check survey data after employment services completed and see what can be improved or changed to better serve clients -apply for grant programs to expand AACOG's Employment Services program and be able to provide more services through greater outreach



## Support & Empowerment for Older Adults with IDD & their Caregivers

Five year grant awarded to AACOG by the Texas Council for Developmental Disabilities (TCDD) in May 2019

Goals:

- Seeks to identify gaps in Texas for older adults with an intellectual/developmental disability (IDD) and caregivers
- Educate older adults with IDD and caregivers on aging
- Implement a local/state policy change to the older adult with IDD



Program:

- Classes are focused on health, finances, spirituality, caregiver care, nutrition, and physical fitness
- Class schedule available or tailored to fit individual/caregiver's schedule

#### Where:

- Offered in-person and online within AACOG's 13-county service area; and online only to the other 241 counties in Texas
  - Those located outside of AACOG's region are offered a tablet to participate in the program which has data service and remote login for assistance in navigation



Who can Participate:

- Caregivers
  - Formal/informal caregivers in a paid/unpaid role and can or cannot be living with the individual
- Individuals with IDD
  - Have to be over the age of 18
  - Do not have to be receiving services in a Waiver or Non-Waiver program
- Professionals in the field



Data:

- Surveys given at the during the program on Social Determinants of Health and Quality of Life
- Surveys are done on the individual and caregiver separately
- Data then collected through IBM's Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS); which will helps us determine effectiveness of the program and what aspect are impacting the individual and caregiver's quality of life


Completion of Program:

 Health & Wellness staff offer navigation services for a full year to address gaps in quality of life and assist in implementation of material learned through the class

- Transportation provided by Uber or Lyft
  - Wheelchair accessible vans (WAV) are available
  - Personal Care Assistants are available
- Basic demographics recorded for grant reporting purposes



## Humana Grant

#### Gym Access

- Funding received from Humana December 2021 to provide one year paid gym memberships at the gym of the individual's choice
- Available to individuals with IDD within AACOG's 13-county service area
- Biometric screening and Quality of Life survey given to individuals
- Basic demographics recorded for grant reporting purposes
- Supplemented with the Support & Empowerment program


